

## **Arts Director's Report:**

Term 3 enrolments are open and coming in steadily. New classes on offer this term include Mosaics for kids and home schoolers, run by Erin Hall. Welcome to BMCAC Erin. Cheryle's Acrylics class has moved from Friday to Thursday evenings as a six week course, so excluding first Thursdays committee meeting nights.

Our Third quarter has begun. Sadly Joy Myres Creed is no longer exhibiting with us. We welcome Jan Organ as a new member of the gallery. Sales over the birthday weekend were very good.

## Pottery Facilitator's Report:

Due to the cold weather and various broken bones and illness, numbers on Monday and Tuesday night drop-in groups have been down. Pottery members can contact me if they wish to have access to the pottery room at any time.

One of the wheels in the pottery room has decided it is a bit tired and will not maintain speed, so will need to be looked at. Plans are in place to have the motor of the wheel in the storeroom replaced, so I hope to get both wheels repaired at that time.

As a number of our batts keep disappearing from the pottery room I have donated my excess batts. Please return any batts you may have used to transport wet pots.






Mounted ARI (Artist Run Initiative) at 80 Paterson Rd, Springwood, NSW 2777

#### Pippin Drysdale - Spirit of Place - opening 5August

#### A solo exhibition in ceramics

Sabbia Gallery is thrilled to present this solo exhibition from West Australian ceramic artist, Pippin Drysdale.

Place, for Pippin Drysdale, represents far more than geographic coordinates on a map. She is concerned with the totality of place: the geology, topography, climatic conditions, vegetation and the inhabitants, those who call this place home.

Spirit of Place is a new body of work by this illustrious artist that considers all these elements and presents a new chapter in the Breakaway Series, rooted not only in the remote Kimberley but also in coastal regions, from Ningaloo in the North West to the Fitzgerald National Park on the southern edge of Western Australia.

Inclusion as a finalist in this year's Wynne Prize at AGNSW focused her attention anew on the landscape and all it supports. 'Wolfe Creek Crater Installation' is one example of the spirit of a place and the installations Drysdale has created for her Sydney audience consciously look at the big and the small in the context of place.

The pots then writhe and squirm and immediately take on the colour of the brew. Then a quick dip into cold water to stop further "cooking" and they're done!

No waiting for three days for the kiln to cool down - not even any waiting while the pots to reduce in a bucket of sawdust - Obvara is immediately gratifying and intensely exciting.

You literally watch the magic happen right in front of your eyes! Join us for a workshop on this addictive pottery process.

# Ready for the "Full Monty"?

# it's time for Naked Raku...Painting with Smoke with Jacqui Sosnowski – SOS Ceramics





Naked Raku is a contemporary variation of the Raku firing technique but instead of using a glaze we will apply slip to the bisqued pots, fire them in a raku kiln, remove when hot, smoke in sawdust or newspaper in a closed container and then quench with water which pops off the slip revealing the "naked" smokey surface of the pot underneath.

The contrast between the dark lines and the unglazed clay surface is what makes Naked Raku vessels visually striking.
