## AGM 2025 MINUTES

#### **PRESIDENT'S AGM REPORT** Alison James

Dear Members,

In 2024 the committee met with some challenges. This was mostly due to changes in the volunteers who had offered to take up positions that had been vacated or having to vacate positions that they already held, as the challenges of their daily life made it difficult to commit the time to those roles.

That said we are always very thankful to those who are willing to try and volunteer for a role and are able to help us maintain or improve the needs and wants of the Centre.

Last year we held our first annual members exhibition just before Mother's Day and made the decision to make the annual pottery exhibition a combined members exhibition due to low numbers of pottery members exhibiting. Sales for both were steady but were lower than previous years.

Our Art Prize went ahead again with some concern over sponsorship funding but entries were again solid, however sales were low. Overall, the advertising for these events could probably be improved upon and without a constant publicity officer we did struggle in this area.

Bookings for the main room across were improved last year with 46 workshops held. This is mostly due to a handful of workshop demonstrators hiring multiple times. The drawing classes in particular with Zorana and her live animals have been well received.

Hare street gallery has had a bit of a setback with no longer being allowed (not that we ever really should have been) to place our sandwich boards down near the highway. This has certainly slowed the flow of customers and sales.

The western wall of the main room received much needed attention. A tight and difficult spot to work in, it has now been repaired and painted thanks to our wonderful maintenance crew. Hopefully now the last of the major maintenance issues have been completed the maintenance team can enjoy a bit of a break and only need to do minor repairs for a while.

The gardens are looking great, ongoing as far as maintaining but such a welcoming and beautiful environment compared to years ago. Garden art has been added this year in the way of a beautiful handmade birdbath from outgoing secretary Bronwyn Campbell and the mosaic for the front welcome wall was completed by Andrea Ketterling.

Overall things can only improve this year and the committee will strive to do their best as always.

#### ART DIRECTOR'S AGM REPORT Ingrid Russell

2024 has been another busy year for BMCAC. We had four solid terms of enrolments in pottery, mosaics, pen and wash, and print making. Pottery for children had a consistent 3-4 classes per week. Children's art classes dropped to one class per week and we lost Chloe Coard as teacher. Alison covered the class for the last term of 2024. We had two homeschool classes, one in pottery and one in art, but art numbers were low in art and have not continued in 2025.

The Annual Art Prize looked like we wouldn't get the entries to make it viable and we didn't have the sponsorship for the main prize covered, however some last minute advertising worked and we decided to cover the main prize ourselves. In the end we had another successful event.

The main room is looking a bit tired after all the use it has had and could probably use a repaint to spruce it up for our 2025 events. Also more hangers were purchased in readiness for the Print Prize and Art Prize for 2025.

#### Hare Street Gallery Report

Hare St Gallery takings were slow through 2024. As we are not able to put the sign out on the highway it seems this has affected our visibility to the passing traffic. We had a number of new members at the start of the year, but this dropped back to seven again by fourth quarter.

#### HEAD GARDENER'S AGM REPORT Liz Bryden

Overall 2024 was a good gardening year due to the regular rain which has meant less watering. On the other hand, due to the rain increasing growth, more trimming and weeding has been necessary. More plants have been added, mainly natives as these have proven themselves hardy. Importantly, maintenance continued on a fortnightly basis throughout the year in line with the green bin collection. Leaves, bark and seed fall were again the biggest jobs requiring hours of blowing and raking which unfortunately left less time for the actual garden. Another issue is that mulch is badly needed on all the garden

beds. The heat and high humidity made it difficult to schedule mulching over the last few months so maybe this is a job for 2025 when it is cooler. A team effort with the mulching would make the job much easier as it is a big job.

#### OTHER AGM REPORTS & BUSINESS

**Pottery Facilitator's report**: As the pottery facilitator resigned towards the end of 2024, there is no report. **Life Drawing report**: Rick took over from term 2. The group was averaging about 10 people each week. Mannequins were used when no model was available.

**Workshop Co-ordinator's report**: There were 46 workshops in 2024, a huge increase from the previous year. Chalk painting was a regular. Room hiring fee to increase from May 2025.

Publicity Officer's report: There was no publicity officer in 2024.

**Grants Officer's report**: Janet got us a small grant which we put towards free workshops through the school holidays.

**Building Co-ordinator's report**: A bird bath was installed and a plaque was purchased. The outside of the western wall was renovated and painted. Possum proofing was done.

**Creations Editor report**: There were 11 issues of Creations in 2024. Usually a monthly edition is planned again in 2025. For the mail-out the members list needs to be updated.

Librarian's report: Some culling was done. Gradually working through library. No donations accepted.

#### ART DIRECTOR'S REPORT Ingrid Russell

Term 1 enrolments and memberships came in steadily and most classes are at or near capacity. We have two mosaics classes, two printmaking classes, a drawing and a watercolour class.

And there are five children's and four adult pottery classes. We welcome Cristina Lafigliola as our Friday pottery teacher. Cristina is running a children's class and an adult's wheel forming class. Apart from a few minor issues, classes are running smoothly.

At the last count BMCAC has 96 financial members, 24 in the pottery group and 7 print makers.

Just a reminder that anyone using either of the studios be mindful and leave the tables and floor clean for the benefit of the following users. Make sure air conditioners are turned off, all doors locked and the barrel of the key lock box turned so the combination does not show. Please report any issues so they can be fixed.

The walls of the main room need painting and any volunteers would be most welcome. Anyone, teachers, students and members who would like to hang their work for a few weeks is welcome to do so, it would brighten up the space between exhibitions. However the BMCAC takes no responsibility for lost or damaged work.

The woman sits clutching her knees inside a short-necked bottle on a beach, looks up smiling at a mouth above all imagined itineraries.

We like to think she volunteered to be lowered into the bottle.

On her own idea, even her own craftiness, lured into being enrobed with the thick glass that is the gray-blue of a ukiyo-e sky of flying cranes who breathe the steam of that bluish gray ideation and end of autumn, or a plume of smoke from a train in the middle distance.

Swells of warm seawater push wet sand against spun tips of seashells that sit on the warmed strand like nobility on a plush settee.

The bottle's bottom edge lists in the hot sand, the heat of the morning sunlight penetrates the bottle walls, and foam and breeze coax a juddering creature from underneath.

From inside the woman argues with herself that the horizon is another of the world's ambitions.

Those ships slipped into bottles with volition and self-responsibility, acquiesce so marvellously, like the glass fitting so smoothly around her. She is a person born to be put into this and admired as perfection from the outside, which is how we love flowers and dreams, though our desires may suffocate them.

#### CONDITIONS - P.1

- The Blue Mountains Print Prize is open to a variety of printmaking methods including; etching, aquatint, collograph, silkscreen, drypoint, linocut, woodblock, lithography, Eco printing and textiles. Fine art commercial printing is permitted on the bases that a hand made element is evident in the finished work.
- The Blue Mountains Creative Arts Centre Committee (the Committee) reserves the right to refuse acceptance of any artwork if deemed offensive, inappropriate or noncompliant with the Terms and Conditions of Entry.
- Works submitted must be your original work and created within the last 24 months prior to the Print Prize.
- Online Entry Forms open, 1 February 2025 and must be submitted by 31 March 2025. To confirm your space, apply at; Apply online https://www.bmcac.org.au/. Must include a clear image!
- 5. A non-refundable entry fee of \$25 per artwork must be included with your Entry Form.
- A sales commission of 27% from each work sold will be retained by the Committee. The balance of works sold will be paid to the artist by direct deposit.
- 7. It is the responsibility of the artist to pay any GST liability to the Australian Taxation Office.
- 8. All works submitted are to be labelled on the back with artist name, artwork title, medium and price.
- Framed works must include D hooks and wire or cord ready for hanging. Unframed works must be attached to foam core board. 3D works will be displayed on plinths or other available apparatus.
- Artists are limited to 2 artworks for exhibition. 2D not exceeding a size 45cm x 35cm framed or unframed. 3D not exceeding a size of 45cmx35cmx35cm.
- 11. All artworks must be dry or they will not be hung.
- All reasonable care will be taken when handling the works submitted. However, no liability will be accepted by the Committee for loss, theft or damage of works before, during or after the art show.
- All transport and insurance costs are the responsibility of the artist.

- Alternative collection arrangements must be received in writing in advance of this event. This includes the requirement of a permission note for a person to collect work on behalf of the artist.
- Artworks are to be delivered to: Blue Mountains Creative Arts Centre, Cnr of Hare and Moore St, Glenbrook, on 5 April between 10am & 2pm - no exceptions.
- The recipients of all awards may have their work featured in promotional materials advertising future events.
- All Blue Mountains Print Prize awards will be open to all members of the public and all members of the Blue Mountains Creative Arts Centre, including Committee Members.
- The BMCAC Youth Print Prize and Highly Commended prize will be judged by the same judges of the adult prizes. The youth prizes are open to all members of the community and Blue Mountains Creative Arts Centre students and members under 25 years of age.
