POTTERY FACILITATOR'S REPORT Kathleen Zanardo

After several inquiries about joining drop-in groups we now have some new members. Welcome to you all. The Monday night group is now full with 8 participants. Tuesday nights are also full. Our group members have been creative, experimenting with metallic glazes, slab work, sgraffito, and found products such as wild clay and ash.

Please consider putting work into the upcoming BMCAC Annual Exhibition on May 3 & 4. Sales are often good because it is held the week before Mother's Day. Our potters should consider the lead-up time required to make, dry and fire (mostly twice) their work in time for this exhibition. Potters will set up their own table of pottery. Please tell me by text or email, as soon as possible, the number of tables you require. Tables, black tablecloths, cork bricks and plinths will be provided. Extra work can be stored under the table to bring out when pieces are sold. If you only have 2 or 3 pieces just let me know and I can work out shared tables. Potters setting up time is 2 - 4pm on Friday 2nd. Looking forward to a good exhibition. (It may be possible to drop off later on Friday if an arrangement has been made prior).

Please be mindful to clean the glaze from the bottom of your pots and leave a gap of several millimetres from the base as we have had several glazes run and get stuck to the shelves.

Classes for term 2 start on May 5th (enrolments open April 1st). There are many pottery classes on offer for adults and children in both hand building and throwing. Please check the BMCAC website for details.

I have had a few enquiries about using our kilns as a firing service. It has been decided, amongst a few of the pottery facilitators, that kiln firings are for active members of BMCAC who participate in either a class or a drop-in group. So unfortunately, there will be no firings for people who are working externally to classes and groups.

HEAD GARDENER'S REPORT Liz Bryden

The garden is looking much greener and fuller thanks to all the rain over the summer months. Not having to drag out hoses and water constantly has made the job much easier and left time for other gardening.

In addition, we have been able to do some mulching this week and the sloped garden beds to the side entry now have some protection which should keep the moisture in the soil. Still some mulching to finish the job but the worst has been completed, so thank you to David Attwood for his Ute and help. Now the garden is looking its best for the Print Prize this weekend.

PRINTMAKING FACILITATOR'S REPORT Cheryle Yin-Lo

We have two printmaking classes this term on Monday mornings and Thursday nights. There is a mixture of new students and returning students.

There has been a lot of excellent work produced and great interest from new students that have joined this term. Students have been exploring innovative types of platemaking from tetrapack, milk bottles and techniques in chine collee to create beautiful colourful backgrounds

for the lino prints. (Fig. 1)

I have been promoting the BM Print Prize 2025 and am happy to start seeing some interest in applications being submitted.

THERE is no one among men that has not a special failing: And my failing consists in writing verses. I have broken away from the thousand ties of life: But this infirmity still remains behind. Each time that I look at a fine landscape: Each time that I meet a loved friend, I raise my voice and recite a stanza of poetry And marvel as though a God had crossed my path.

Ever since the day I was banished to Hsün-yang Half my time I have lived among the hills. And often, when I have finished a new poem, Alone I climb the road to the Eastern Rock. I lean my body on the banks of white stone: I pull down with my hands a green cassia branch. My mad singing startles the valleys and hills: The apes and birds all come to peep. Fearing to become a laughing-stock to the world, I choose a place that is unfrequented by men.
