

#### POTTERY FACILITATOR'S REPORT Kathleen Zanardo

Our May Members Exhibition in the Glenbrook Theatre Hall was a great success. Our potters exhibited a wide variety of works showcasing their many talents. Everything from domestic ware to artistic pieces were on display, with many works sold. The number of visitors was high as the weekend coincided with the Glenbrook Markets and election day. I hope all our potters will consider entering work in the following exhibition in October. A reportage will follow in June 'Creations'.

Attendance in our drop-in groups has remained high with an average of seven to eight people in each group. A balance of hand-builders and throwers keeps the space in the room workable.

Pottery members can access the pottery room at any time for casual attendance but they'll need to discuss this with their facilitator (if a class, a booked session or a workshop is using the pottery room you won't be able to have a casual visit). Please make sure you pay the required \$5 for each three-hour visit and write your name and the date in the Casual Attendance Book and place your money in the purple money tin or pay using the Tyro machine.

Ongoing problems with the kilns has led us to believe the issue could be one of the controllers. The current firing should establish if there is a need to have an electrician look at the problem.

#### PRINTMAKING FACILITATOR'S REPORT Cheryle Yin-Lo

#### LIFE DRAWING FACILITATOR'S REPORT Rick Hawkins

The Life Drawing group continues to produce some great depictions of the human body with drawers working away furiously but silently except for the sounds of charcoal or graphite or oil stick scraping over paper and the accompanying murmur of chill-out ambient music. Our first session of Term 2 featured Katya who's originally from Belorussia and has never modelled for us before. It's always good to have a new model, though we love our regular models too, of course, and we're hoping that Kat will become one of the regulars, along with stalwarts such as Joey, David, Alicia, Benedicta and Emily.

Numbers are down a bit this term, though I expect there could be an increase as the term goes on. Our most recent session's participants on May 16 were Rudi, Gus, Pero, Anna, Graham and me with the lovely and always-dependable Alicia doing the modelling.

There are a range of styles in our group along with a wide range of media: charcoal in all its forms (pencil, willow, compressed, tinted); graphite pencil; coloured pencil concluding watercolour pencils, oil stick (this is Sheree Green's specialty and there's an example of her lovely work below); pen and ink; watercolour; pastels and even Sharpies!

We hope to see some more BMCAC members take advantage of the discount received if you sign up for a term of Life Drawing or even if you come along to as many sessions as you can manage. If you're a member signed up for a term the cost for each LD session is only \$25. If you're a member and not signed up for a term the cost for each session is \$35. Non-members pay \$45 per session. As well as a professional model we provide easels, donkeys, etc., and tea, coffee, biscuits and almost always, bananas, along with other delicious nibbles plus the company of a group of dedicated, committed and friendly drawers.








In the stars and the air


Drippin' off the moon and landin' in her brain.


