- 4. Art works are to be dropped off at 1pm, pottery, mosaics etc. at 2pm on Friday 17 Oct.

### POTTERY FACILITATOR'S REPORT Kathleen Zanardo

We recently held the BMCAC Art Prize. Of the many ceramic entries, there were two prizes awarded. Congratulations to Katrina Bodey for her work 'A Place Called Home' awarded the Roy Brooks Prize for Ceramics/Sculpture. Also, congratulations to Henry Tankard for 'Indian Myna' gaining Commended Ceramics.

Term 4 classes start on October 20th (enrolments are open with limited spots remaining). The pottery classes are offered for adults and children in both hand building and throwing. Please check the BMCAC website for details.

Some of the pottery equipment may be borrowed for use at home. Items such as banding wheels, ribs, knives, sponges, cutters, trimmers etc. are available. There is a Borrowing Book in the white cupboard that needs to be filled out with your name, the item, and date. Please check with your teacher or facilitator before borrowing and return the items within a week.

Once a kiln is unpacked the room can get quite congested so please collect all your fired pieces from the kiln room as soon as possible. Pieces that seem to be abandoned will be put outside on the table.
